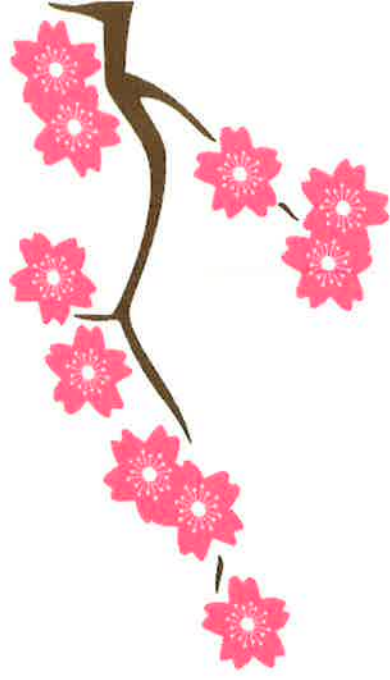

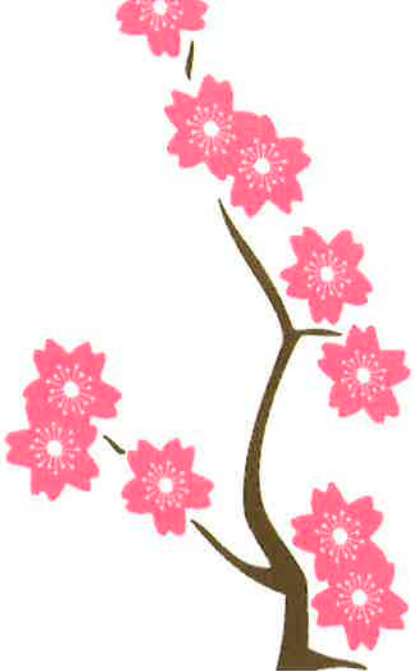

We provide classroom presentations to students to raise awareness of the impact of sexual harassment and sexual assault and to facilitate discussions that empower youth to take part in the effort to make their schools and communities safer. Each presentation is free, age-appropriate, subject to outcome-based evaluation and is designed with the goal of eliminating sexual violence in our communities. Advocacy

Advocacy as well as all services at the Sexual Assault Center of Pierce County is centered on encouraging the empowerment of victims and survivors during their healing journey. Advocacy services are available through the 24-hour crisis intervention, information, and referral line that can be called by victims at any time. Highly trained and empathic Advocates operate the crisis line and offer general support advocacy services to those immediate needs of sexual assault victims. Advocates offer Medical and Legal Advocacy services when victims struggle to navigate through often intimidating medical and legal processes. These specialized services may include assistance obtaining non-contact orders and completing paperwork, referrals to attorneys and accompaniment to court proceedings as well as ensuring patient rights are observed, confidentially is maintained, and all medical proceedings are understood.

The Advocacy Program of the SACPC is provided free of charge to any victim/survivor of sexual assault or abuse and their friends and family members. The sexual assault may have been a recent occurrence, in the past or even during childhood. Most victims of sexual assault experience trauma-induced life disruptions, such as physical health issues, flashbacks, inability to trust, inability to be intimate, post-traumatic stress syndrome, suicide attempts, poor coping skills, the breakup of families, substance abuse, self-harm, and more. These may occur immediately after an assault, or many years later. SACPC advocates help sexual assault victims determine what services can help them and how they can be accessed while providing emotional support and guidance.

Therapy Services

Therapy can be very effective in helping you heal at any point following sexual assault, abuse or harassment. Therapy is provided by master's level therapists who have specialized training and experience in helping survivors of sexual violence and their loved ones move forward. We provide individual, couples, family and group therapy for adolescents and adults. The length of treatment is determined by your need. We accept some insurance and offer a very generous sliding fee scale for those in need of financial assistance. Please call for more information or to find out how therapy may help you.
